A Fall Full of Holidays

My Dear Friends,

We often say that holidays are early this year or late this year. But this year in particular, they really are early, as early as they ever are. *Erev Rosh Hashanah* falls on September 4, just two days after Labor Day. Even more astonishing, *Chanukah* happens this year on Thanksgiving.

That confluence is unprecedented. November 28 is the latest Thanksgiving can occur and also the earliest *Chanukah* can happen. The last time those dates coincided was in 1861. However, President Lincoln formally established Thanksgiving only two years later, in 1863. So *Chanukah* and Thanksgiving have never before fallen on the same day. The two holidays will next coincide in the year 79,811, unless one calendar or the other is changed in the intervening millennia.

Because Rosh Hashanah is so early, all the traditional fall holidays this year will occur in the month of September: Kol Nidre on the evening of September 13; Yom Kippur on September 14; Sukkot on September 19 and 20; Hoshanah Rabbah and Shemini Atzeret on September 25 and 26; and Simchat Torah on September 27.

We are introducing an innovation in our service on the first day of *Rosh Hashanah*. During our Torah service that day, I will invite the recitation of the *Gomel* blessing by anyone who feels moved to do so. This will happen after the reading of the third aliyah, the one in which God spares Ishmael and Hagar after they have been banished into the desert.

The *Gomel* blessing gives thanks for surviving a dangerous life passage. It has traditionally been recited after returning safely from a dangerous voyage, or escaping an accident or near-accident, or after major surgery, or after any similar life experience we are grateful is behind us. I will ask all who wish to participate, those who have had such an experience or whose friend or family member has had one, to stand in place. The text of the prayer will be in a handout everyone will receive upon entering the sanctuary, with transliteration to make it easy to recite the prayer. The first part of the prayer is a blessing for having survived. The congregation will respond with thanks on your behalf and a wish for future safety.

Those reciting the blessing will say:

Baruch atah Adonai Eloheinu Melech ha'olam, ha-gomel lachayaveem tovot, sheh g'malanee kol tov.

Blessed are You, Adonai, our Sovereign of all time and space, Who graciously bestows favor and Who has been gracious to me.

The congregation responds:

Mee sheh g'malchem kol tov, Hoo yigmalchem kol tov, selah!

May the One who has been good and gracious to you this time, be good and gracious to you at all times. Amen!

Alice and I look forward to greeting you on Rosh Hashanah. May we all be written in the Book of Life for a good year.

Education

As an Educator, I am always trying to continue my learning experiences and pass on information to others. This year, I have been further enlightened about history, the history of our country, through a new film, Lee Daniels' The Butler. It is history seen through the eyes of Eugene Allen, known in the film as Cecil Gaines, who served as a Butler in the White House for seven administrations, from President Eisenhower through Ronald Reagan. The role of the butler is portrayed by Forest Whitaker and his wife by Oprah Winfrey. Through this film, we follow the Civil Rights Movement, the Vietnam War, the impact of each president and the interaction of families, especially father and son with opposing views. We see a man's journey from the abusive sharecropping of the cotton fields of the South, to working in the White House, and the struggles for equality, fairness, and freedom. The stellar cast and the outstanding direction of Lee Daniels bring out authentic performances.

I had the good fortune of speaking with Will Haygood, upon whose article about Eugene Allen Danny Strong based his screenplay. I had the opportunity to meet cast members and attend the private showing of the film with President Bush Sr., in Kennebunkport, visiting his summer family compound, and attending the premiere in New York City, and the special showing of the film to the Kennedy family, including Patrick and Congressman Joseph Kennedy. President Kennedy, well portrayed by James Marsden, is featured in the film. Those of us who lived through the Kennedy assassination, either as children or adults were defined by it and the era. Eugene Allen lived it in the White House, and through his service, dignity, and dedication made his contribution to the Civil Right Movement. According to Reverend Martin Luther KingJr, those who served made a major impact and were and are heroes. His son, played by Danny Oyelowo, became an activist, a Freedom Rider and after the assassination of Martin Luther King Jr a Black Panther. We see father and son at odds and the impact on the family. They are both heroes, each in their own way. There was a March on Washington led by Dr. King in 1963. A March to commemorate this momentous occasion was held on August 24th, 2013.

I am pleased to mention that my son Matthew Salloway is an Executive Producer of the film. It is through his involvement and his inclusion of both my husband and me in this exciting endeavor, that we have had such a meaningful experience. I am proud of his accomplishment and his involvement and contribution to this relevant meaningful film, with its educational and strong message about freedom, justice, equality, family and human decency.

November is the 50th anniversary of the tragic assassination of John F. Kennedy. Please be aware that there will many observances, especially at the Kennedy Library.

We refer to the 1963 speech of the late Martin Luther King Jr. as the I HAVE A DREAM speech. It is now 2013, I ask each of you to complete this sentence, I HAVE A DREAM THAT................ Please email your response to me at <u>JSalloway@aol.com</u>.
